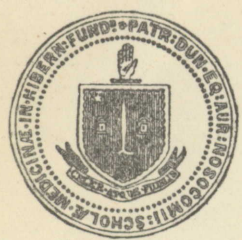

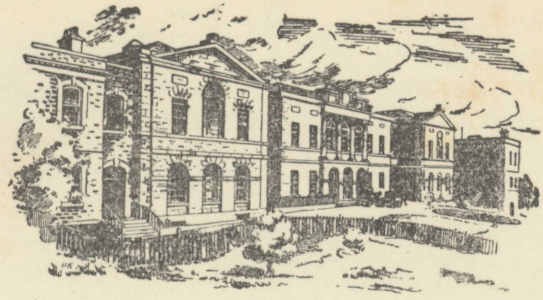


Following up our claim dated 11th. August last for £25-11-0 for goods lost during the Rebellion as detailed in that claim as belonging to this Hospital. I now on behalf of the Board of Governors of this Hospital desire to make a supplemental claim for 100 pounds weight of ~~tea~~, which had been paid for by the Governors, to Messrs Bewley Sons & Co. of Henry Street, last March, when the Governors bought some three hundred pounds weight of tea at a special price at the time, and the Company were paid £30 down for it, they undertaking to keep the tea in their stores and to supply it out in quantities from time to time as required by the Hospital.

We had used two hundred pounds weight of the tea up to the time of Rebellion, and the balance 100 lbs. was lost with Bewley & Co's firm during Rebellion,

A and the Company now disclaims all responsibilities for the loss of the
100 lbs. of tea, £10, and they say we should apply to you for the loss,
so I write to ask you to be so good as to allow me to have the necessary
blue forms to be filled up for our supplemental claim as stated.
