Remarks

This Grandfather Clock appears to have been bought by Claimant from Mrs. Keane of Roundwood, Co. Wicklow, in March 1915 for a sum of £5. 10. 0. Claimant states that he left the Brass Dial and the works with Wm. Walsh in the beginning of April, asking him for an estimate to repair same, and that he left his name and address but Mr. Walsh never communicated with him until he called subsequent to the Rebellion and found the Dial missing. This statement conflicts with Mr. Walsh's who affirms that in December 1915 or January 1916 Mr. Dunne called hurriedly from a Motor Car with the Brass Dial ^{Signature} square, leaving no address and saying he would call next day for an estimate for repairs. The Works which are there to be seen are in a rusty condition, ^{Date} many portions being missing, and Mr. Walsh states they are useless. He could not apprise Claimant of this fact before the Rebellion because he had no address for him, and it was not until July that Mr. Dunne put in an appearance for the Dial and Works (The mahogany case of the Clock is in Mr. Dunne's possession).

In reply to yours of the 8th inst. Mr. Dunne was not aware that the clock had been looted from Mr. Walsh until the past few days, and we have written Mr. Walsh threatening to hold him responsible for the amount in the event of your Committee not allowing the claim.

II

We have also been consulted by Messrs. Dunne & Co. with reference to the Cheque which you sent them in settlement of their claim, and they have asked us to point out to you that the balance of their ^{claim} should be paid.

You seem to have allowed them about half the amount, and as a matter of fact they had not included in their ^{claim} the windows which were broken, nor the carriage on the goods which is a total loss to them. We would thank you to again bring this matter before your Committee and obtain payment of the balance of our Client's claim. The loss is a very serious one for the firm.
