I beg to bring under the notice of my Authorities that I lost the following private articles of clothing at the battle of Ashbourne on 28:4:16:- an outside shirt price 6/6, an inside shirt price 5/6, and a waistcoat worth approximately about 8/-, and a pair of braces price 2/6.

The above mentioned articles were cut off me at the seat of the battle to enable the Sinn Fein doctor to dress my wounds

I also beg to add my haversack was taken by the Rebels.
