Dear Sir,

We received instructions on the 11th inst. to put forward a claim by Mr. John Mulcahy, draper, of Clonmel, Co Tipperary, for the sum of £12: 17: 6 in respect of goods which were consigned to him by Messrs. J & N. Philips & Co. Ltd., of 35, Church Street, Manchester. The goods were forwarded on one of the boats of Messrs. Tedcastle McCormick & Co. and were ^{looted} loaded from the stores of that firm in Dublin during the Rebellion. Our client applied in the first instance to the consignors and was referred by them to Messrs. Tedcastle McCormick & Co. On his placing the matter in our hands two days ago we advised him to apply to your committee as the case would appear to be a proper one for compensation on the ground of looting.

In the circumstances we take it that the claim is not too late to be dealt with by your committee. If you will kindly let us have the necessary forms we will have the Declaration made by our client.
