

Dear Sir,

Referring to the Claim for compensation lodged by our Client Miss McAnaspie, who had her Warerooms at 16 Lower Sackville Street, and which claim has been duly paid by the Government, we included when preparing this claim, the sum of £2. being the value placed upon a silk Coat the property of Miss Elizabeth Henry of The Fish & Fowl Market, South City Market, Dublin, which coat was with Miss McAnaspie to be altered at the time of the fire. When dealing with Miss McAnaspie's claim the Assessor struck the £2. out stating that the Coat should be claimed for by Miss Henry herself. We accordingly duly notified Miss Henry at the time, but as she was unwell, the matter was allowed to lie over, and this morning she called upon us to know if she can now make a Claim for compensation for the £2. struck out of Miss McAnaspie's Claim.
