I beg to make application on behalf of Capt: L. S. N. Palmer for £20:0:0 for injuries done to his car whilst garaged at Mr: Mc Jaggart's, 45 King Street, Dublin.

The car was taken out of this Garage by the Sinn Feiners and used as a barricade at Stephen's Green on the morning of April 24th: 1916.

It was afterwards recovered by the Military and a considerable amount of damage was done to same.

One cushion, tools, and one lamp were taken away altogether. I will be able to send you full particulars in the course of a few days.

I may state that Capt: Palmer was obliged to go to the Front at short notice and hence the delay in sending claim.

He only sent instructions to the Military Authorities last week to have the car taken back to Mr: Mc Jaggart's for him to examine same and see what damage was really done to same.

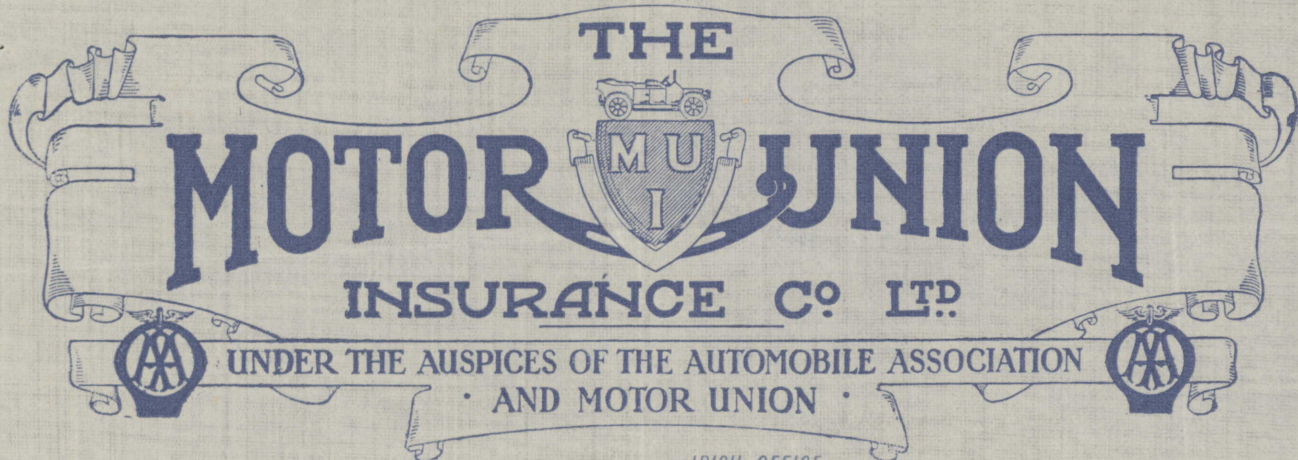
