In accordance with your instructions I have made a further inspection of Mr D'Vine's property, and beg to advise that, with one or two trifling exceptions, damage to the amount of my valuation has now been made good.

on South side of these premises was stated to have been repaired in August 1916. On the occasion of my visit in November last the roof or gutter was still defective, the party-wall quite wet, the plaster loose, and the damp had spoiled the new wall paper &c. in the adjoining room. (see Estimate No 1.) On 9th inst. the party-wall still showed signs of dampness, and nothing further had been done to the interior.

Greek St. Dublin. The wooden balustrade has now been replaced, and has been covered with Tar instead of Paint. This repair appears to have been effected quite recently.

was called in to remedy some small injury to this roof, he suggested to Mr D'Vine the advisability of overhauling the whole roof, generally. It is the cost (£25) of these general repairs that the Treasury is now asked to pay. I question if any material damage was done to this particular roof by the Military, and in any event the portion of general repairs applicable would not exceed £10. In this view I am supported by the Contractor, Mr Gourlie.

These Estimates and receipts would lead one to believe that Mr Young was an independent Contractor who had carried out the repairs and been paid in due course.

This gentleman, however, is Mr D'Vine's Agent for his house property, and Mr D'Vine admits that the receipts sent forward were not for specific payments made to Mr Young, but that the cost of Repairs would be taken out of Rents collected on his behalf. (see also Mr Young's letter of 28/8/16)

Some of the repairs supposed to be paid for are not yet carried out. The Telephone Number (726) appearing at the head of Mr Young's memo. forms is really that of Mr D'Vine's Ballroom.



Explanation

As to lateness in lodging claim, this is explained by the fact that the premises No 23 & 24 Lower Bridge Street are closed from April to September as they are used by Claimant as a Dancing Academy during the winter only, and the damage was not discovered for some time after the Rebellion.

Apart from this the damage being principally to the roofs of all the premises it was not discovered till an considerable time after and the fact also, that Claimant was staying in England for a period of nearly two months deterred him from attending to the damage or preferring a claim for same.
