We are in receipt of your letter of yesterday re damage and loss due to the Easter disturbances. In reply be g to say that we have never seen or heard of any such announcement in the local Press giving ^a the date limit for claims. We do not see the Dublin papers, as they do not circulate here. We have no Dublin Agent, but only shop-men at our various Branches. We certainly think our employees might have sent us a copy of the advertisement on the chance that we might be interested, and we are writing for an explanation.

We would remind you that our claim was sent in originally on May 13th, addressed to the proper Official, and although he was superseded later by the Special Committee, we were quite ignorant of the fact that claims would have to be sent in a-fresh. We would ask the Committee in the circumstances not to exclude us from all consideration on the point of date limit, and we think you will agree that our claim should be treated on its merits. We shall be very glad to hear that you are able to deal with it accordingly.

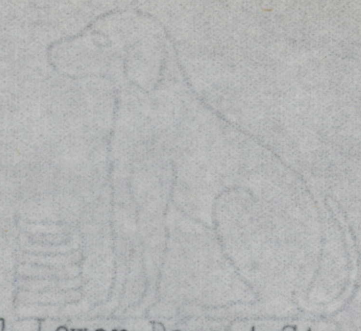

We regret to report that during the recent outbreak in Dublin, our premises situated at 11, Lower Dorset Street, Dublin, were broken open and looted on April 25th, the plate glass window being smashed, interior fittings damaged or destroyed, and a quantity of saleable goods entirely removed. We have had the window reglazed and the shop fittings are being replaced or repaired, as necessary, and we estimate the loss actually suffered amounts to £151-1-6, for which we submit claim, detailed particulars to follow.

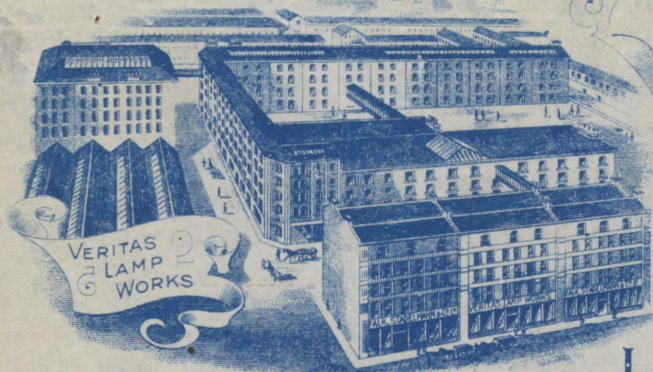
