
The extensions furnished are correct but the amount per bag has been given wrongly. Lot 32 - 12 Bags of mixed Flake

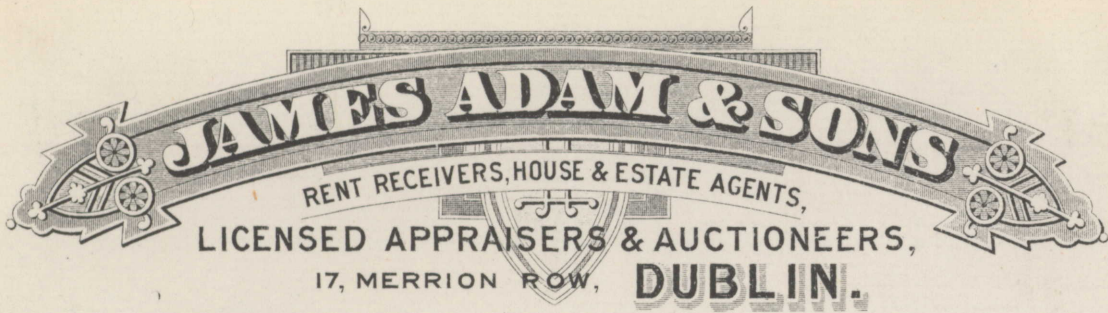
The mistake is a clerical error owing chiefly to the clerk's sheets having been blotted through the bad weather which prevailed at the time of the sale.

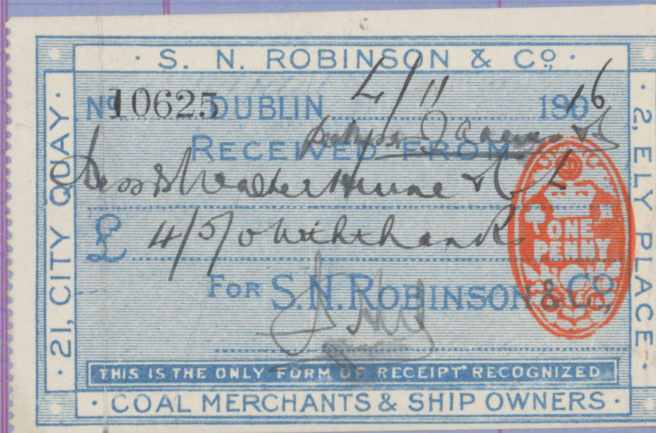

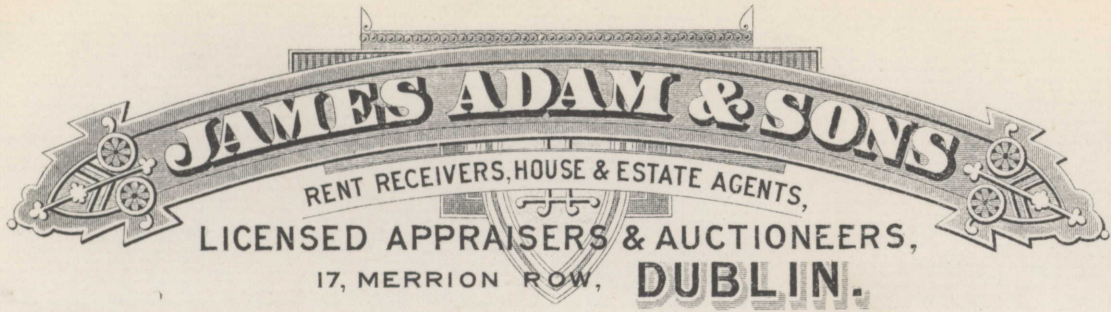
