and Thomas for being a
member of the Irish volunteers,
they were taken to Richmond
Barracks Dublin, and soon
afterwards sent to
Wandsworth Camp,
about the end of May
Mrs Taylor went there
to visit them. It was
then her son Thomas
reported to her that his
gold watch, chain, and
locket was stolen, and
gave her a description
of the articles. Mrs
Taylor reported the matter
to me on the 5th of June
and gave me the attached
description made out and
signed by her son.
I made a report of the
matter it went to the
military Authorities
Mr Ingoldsby.
