Claimant is personally known to me and I consider the amount claimed reasonable.

Would you kindly send me two claim forms to make a claim under the following circumstances - Miss Lyon of Merrion Row, a most respectable old lady, whom I know personally, was pressed for a little money in September, 1915, and pawned two gold watches, and guards, at Margaret Lowry's, 85 Marlboro' Street, she informs me on going there this week to pay the interest that her property was looted by the military

and cannot be produced. The pawnbroker states he has put in a claim for a lot of other goods taken, but these articles were not included as it is only as claims are made that he discovers what is missing. The claim would have been made at the proper time if the lady had known that her property was taken. I can vouch for the honesty of the claimant.
