Dear Sir,

Mrs Katherine Grilly writes to me stating that on May the 3rd last the Military Authorities searched her house ⁵¹ 51, Camden Street, Dublin, for arms and ammunition but found none, that in doing so the men broke one of the ceilings of the house. The Officer in charge told Mrs Grilly to apply to the Officer Commanding Royal Irish Rifles, Portobello Barracks and all the damage would be repaired. Mrs Grilly informs me that she has written to that address three times and also that she has communicated with you but that she has not received any reply. The tenant of the house complains of the cold consequent on the damaged ceiling and obviously it is a matter for immediate settlement. May I ask you to be good enough to have the matter adjusted with the least possible delay. It is only right to add that Mrs Grilly makes no complaint of the searching of house, pointing out in her letter to me that all the houses in the row were similarly searched.
