Our client - Mr. A.B. Evans, trading as T. Switzer & Co., Saddlers, of 78 Dame Street, Dublin - instructed us to apply under the Malicious Injury Act for compensation for damage done to his premises during the rebellion, the damage consisting of the breaking of two plate-glass windows in the shop 78 Dame Street. On the 26th of May last our client having sworn the usual deposition we served Notice under the Malicious Injury Act.

On the 12th inst. we received the enclosed letter from our client at which we were much surprised, as we had not received any definite instructions from him to send in a claim to your Committee and were under the impression that our client was claiming himself through the Property Losses Committee Association.

We hasten to give you notice of our client's claim and are having the usual form of Declaration completed and will lodge same without delay. Trusting that under the circumstances no objection will be raised by reason of the claim not having been made within the specified time.

We may add that the cost of repairing the two plate-glass windows would be about £8-15-0 and there will be a further small item for some glass which at first it was thought it would not be necessary to re-place but which has since cracked considerably.

Glass and I went to the insurance Co. and they informed me that. all those
claims had been taken from the Records. and placed in the Government's
hands for compensation. and that no doubt you had done it for me.
and if not will you do so. as soon as possible.
