I beg to inform you that I had the manuscript of a serial story which I wrote in collaboration with Miss Ada Peter appearing in The Weekly Freeman during the rising, & two-thirds of it was destroyed by fire. We applied to The Freeman's Journal Ltd for compensation for having to rewrite that portion, & the Company are inclined to re-judicate liability, & we now make a claim of £20 upon the Committee as £30 was the amount already stipulated by agreement.

We were depending upon the Company to make good our loss, otherwise we would have put in a claim long before this.
