The circumstances of my Case are as follows. I am the owner of a Cab (No 531) and of a Horse which I had stabled at the rear of 14 Herbert Place and in which my horse was stabled for the purpose of feeding my horse. I was suddenly fired upon and shot in the right thigh and I fell to the ground. I was taken by some Nurses attached to the Private Hospital 29 Upper Mount St into that House and from there to St Patrick's Duons Hospital from which I was taken to St Vincent's Hospital where I remained from said 1st May to the 10th Aug. I am still unable to do any work as I cannot walk without the aid of two Crutches. My horse I was informed was not fed for some days after the 1st May and as a result it got an attack of Laminitis from which it is still suffering it was under the care of a Veterinary Surgeon in the Veterinary College Ballsbridge and is now out at grass and it will be unable to do any work for some time yet. I have no means of livelihood except my horse & cab and were it not that my Son & Daughters here looked after me and supported me I would have had to go to the Poorhouse. I respectfully hope that an allowance will be made to me for this claim I have sustained and for the loss I have suffered thro being unable to work my horse & cab for upwards of five months.

The circumstances of my case are as follows, I am the owner of a cab (No 531) and of a horse which I had stabled at the care of 14 Herbert Place, on Monday 1st May 1916 between 12.30 p.m. and 1 p.m. I was going up the lawnway which runs at the care of Herbert Place and in which my horse was stabled for the purpose of feeding my horse I was suddenly fired upon and shot in the right thigh and I fell to the ground, I was taken by some nurses attached to the Pinaak Hospital 29 Gpr Mount St into their house and from there to Sir Patrick Manson Hospital where I remained from which I was taken to St Vincent's Hospital where I remained from said 1st May to the 10th August

I am still unable to do any work as I cannot walk without the aid of two crutches. My horse I was informed was not fed for some days after the 1st May and as a result it got an attack of laminitis from which it is still suffering. It was under the care of a Veterinary Surgeon in the Veterinary College, Ballsbridge and is now out at grass and it will be unable to do any work for some time yet. I have no means of livelihood except my horse and cab. and were it not that my son & daughters have looked after me and supported me. I would have had to go to the Poor House. I respectfully hope that an allowance will be made to me for this claim have sustained and for the loss I have suffered thro. being unable to work.
