## Claim for Damages caused during the Disturbances on the 24th April, 1916, and following days.

I Mrs Aileen Dillon now residing  
at The Square Lestowel in the City of Kerry  
County of Kerry

do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 25 day of April

1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:— the dwelling house  
used as a Police Barracks at Oranmore, County Salway was  
fired into by persons taking part in the Rebellion whereby the  
door windows window panes were shattered and broken and the glass  
in the windows and also the walls were damaged  
and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by \*\* the said  
persons who took part in the Rebellion

## PARTICULARS OF THE CLAIM.

Injury to R.I.C. Barrack  
Cranmore (by rebels)

County of Galway W.R.  
Cranmore 9. 12. 16

I beg to report that on  
the 25. 4. 16 about 400 armed  
Rebels took possession of the  
Village of Cranmore a number  
of these armed with shot-  
guns attacked the R.I.C.  
Barrack & fired several  
shots through the windows  
with the result the 14 large  
panes of glass measuring  
2 ft 2 ins by 1 ft 2 ins and 12  
smaller panes in all 29  
panes were broken. In  
addition the frames of four  
windows were damaged  
by the gun shot; also two  
wooden shelf brackets  
in dayroom was damaged  
with minor injury to the inside  
wall of dayroom

Material labour is now  
very expensive but not-  
withstanding I am of



the opinion that £20 or  
at most £25 - would repair  
the damage done by the  
rebels on this occasion

Your letter of the 11<sup>th</sup> inst to Messrs Blake & Kenny Solicitors Galway herein has been forwarded by them to me as I am Solicitor for Mrs Aileen Dillon.

As requested by you in this letter I enclose herewith Specifications and Estimate of Mr Michael Kelly for the repairs of damage done to the Barracks at Oranmore during last year's rebellion. The repairs, however, have not yet been carried out.

X You will see that the present Estimate is only £24:12:0.  
At first there was a claim filed under the malicious  
Injuring acts for the sum of £50. At the time this claim was  
filed only a very rough estimate of the damage done could be  
made as the claim had to be filed within three days of the  
Commissioners of the damage.

I propose to do the work at Oranmore Barracks for Messrs Joyce Mackie & Co.

SUPPLY and fix to two front openings new frames and sashes; Wrot pulleystiles and heads 3" by 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ "; Rabbid sills 1"; outside and inside casings  $\frac{1}{2}$ "; parting heads 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " inside slips hang in same. 2" moulded sashes. Glaze with 21 oz. glass with cords and metal sash weights and secure with brass sash fastenings.

SUPPLY and fix 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " framed and panelled backs and elbows, 1" rounded capping, framed and pannelled Soffet, 12" shutter bars, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " moulded back folds.

SUPPLY and fix two openings at back, new frames and sashes, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wrot pulleystiles and heads 3" by 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rabbid sill, 1" rounded outside and inside casing,  $\frac{1}{2}$ " parting heads hang in same. 2 Moulded sashes double hung with metal weights and cord, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " metal pulleys and secure with brass fasteners.

SUPPLY and fix two framed brackets in day room; re-plaster wall. Give new work 3 coats of oil paint to bring it to the same shade as present colour.

HACK OUT and re-glaze with 21 oz. glass 16 panes in existing windows. Give all new timber work 3 coats of oil paint to match existing work.

For the sum of £24 = 12 = 0.

The frames sashes and casing in front are holed by bullets and cannot be repaired so must be renewed, also all glass included in above estimate has been broken by bullets. The brackets and walls in day-room were also damaged by bullets.




