

Lany, Zemplemartin, braughwell, and lodged there for the night, intending to go fishing the following morning. Faly is a din terner and four of his sons were out with the rebelo at the Time, but Wills' loyalt was never suspected, and he never took any part in the Sinn Fin movement. At 6-15 A.M. on 28 & April. a past of rebelo from Moyade took Wills poisoner, and carried off his bicycle and other property. The was kept a poisoner until morning of 29 th The fishing rod was subsequently recovered at Mayade and returned to the owner & the claim may safely be reduced by the value of that article. The value of the other articles is probably very much exaggerated but the Police are not in a position to prove this. It certainly
