

Dear Sir

Thank you very much for your letter of 11<sup>th</sup> inst.  
and in reply I beg to state that the injury was done to  
16 Gordon Place by the military firing from Darcy's  
public house at a tenement from which a rebel was  
"sniping" at them.

I was 36 years in the R. I. C. & 19 years a Sergeant, and  
my sympathy with the military is as strong as my  
hostility to the "Sinn Feiners". Consequently I let  
the matter slide until the tenants requested me  
to repair the Cottage, altho' the amount seems small  
its large to me. I know I am late, and that "rules  
are made to promote an end", yet I trust that you  
may be able to admit this small claim. I am a poor  
man with 7 children - 6 boys & 1 girl, ages varying  
from 3 to 14 1/2 years. I was "Gallery Foreman" in the  
"Coliseum" & that's gone too. I am one of 6 brothers who  
were sewing the Empire together, 5 in the Police &  
1 in the Army. Each of the 20 families in Gordon Place  
have all the male members of Military <sup>age</sup> at the front - save those  
who are invalided or killed in action. Thanking you in  
anticipation I am your obedient servant.
