We have carefully examined the roof, as requested by you and beg to state, we have discovered bullet holes in the slating, caused by the recent rebellion, also there were two breaches in the roof, which were caused by falling stones, which we found lying in the gutters. We have pleasure in quoting you as follows for the necessary repairs.

To repair the breaches by supplying and fixing new ton slates, also making good damage caused by the fixing of same, rendering the underside in haired mortar. There are also a number of loose slates which are being refixed, also the gutters require to be cleaned out.

For the sum of £15 : 0 : 0 NETT. X
(Fifteen pounds).

We have put the work in hands and shall complete with the least possible delay.
