Dear Sir, We have recently engaged two domestic servants from Ireland. One of them Kate Donohoe was at the time of the recent rebellion in the service of Captain Walsh (823) 17 Lower Parkville St, Dublin. She tells me the house was wrecked by the rebels & that she lost her personal effects & clothing. She says she put in a claim for £12 through Captain Walsh for compensation, but she cannot get any information, although she has made several applications. I should esteem it a favour therefore, if you would kindly say what the position is. To establish my good faith I may add that I am the manager of the Manchester & County Bank Ltd, Preston.
