do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 24 or 26 April 1916 1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:— * 66, 67, and 68

and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by** Fire during the disturbances in the City

And I further declare that the Property and Articles specified on the other side were so destroyed or damaged; that the Cost Price of same was as shown in each case; that at the time of the destruction or damage they were respectively of the Values specified under the head "Value of Property at time of Destruction or Damage"; and that, in consequence of such destruction or damage, claim is hereby made for the sums specified under the head "Amount Claimed"; that the Claim is made by me as† an Annuitant on the property; and that I do not know the other persons interested in the said property except:


