With reference to your enquiry to-day - Mrs. Hannah Price, in whose name the claim has been sent forward, is the absolute Owner of Nos. 11 & 22 Moore Street, and her son Albert E. Price is the Owner of 23 Moore Street.

The following are the particulars of the tenure of the respective premises:-

- (1) No. 11 is held under Lease dated 6th Septr. 1866 from William Thomas Betty to Philip Meighan for a term of 99 years from 6 Sept. 1866 at the yearly rent of £24;
- (2) No. 22 (part of) is held under Lease dated 3rd August 1843: Charles Meredyth to James McCabe for a term of 170 years from 1847 at the yearly rent of £11: 11/- ; also Lease dated 20th November 1901 from Christopher Grimes to George Price for a term of 150 years from the 18th October 1901 at the yearly rent of £25; also Lease dated 21st November 1847 from George Newton to James McCabe for a term of 180 years from 21st Novr. 1847 at the yearly rent of £5.
- (3) No. 23 is held under Fee Farm Grant dated 22nd Feby. 1864: Elizabeth Cooke to Jonathan Pim and Thomas Pim at the yearly rent of £28: 0: 6.

I do not see what you require these particulars for in respect to this claim, as there are only two very small items in respect to the premises, namely: £4: 10: 5 and £5: 18: 5. The large item £121: 7: 6 is for plate glass.


