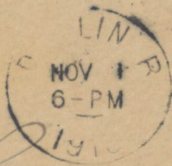

Dear Mr Healy,

I enclose a claim on behalf of Mrs Margaret Walsh in respect of property lost by looting during the disturbances. Mrs Walsh is the widow of my late chief clerk, and is now employed by the Corporation as house-keeper at No 3 Cork Hill. The property in question was stored by her with Miss Kane, 169 Capel St. Mrs Walsh sent forward no claim up to the present, as she understood from Miss Kane that the latter had included in her claim a sum to cover the property in question. It appears, however, that the amount awarded to Miss Kane did not include anything in respect of this property. I ~~hope~~ hope, under the circumstances, the Committee will see its way to consider the claim in view of this explanation.

I may add that I am informed the figure put down by Miss Kane to cover the whole of Mrs Walsh's property was merely an estimated lump sum, and the detailed statement made out by Mrs Walsh shows that the property was considerably undervalued in that estimate. Owing to the death of her husband, who was a highly esteemed member of my staff she and her two children have been left in straightened circumstances, and the loss of the property
