Dear Sir,

In connection with the
recent Rebellion in Dublin
I beg to say that on the 26th
April 1916. my house, at
above address, was fired into

some 14 bullets having entered my bed-room, breaking the iron partition outside the windows, also the glass in two windows & the shutters & destroying window hangings, blinds, and curtains, and totally destroying a valuable mirror, and other articles in the bed room to the amount of £6.

The police examined the damage done at the time, and informed me that they forwarded

the particulars, and amount, (£6.) to your office.

Kindly oblige by letting me know if you have rec^d same, and how the claim stands presently, and when I may expect the amount sought for. I am a poor man, and would require this claim paid as soon as possible. The bullets referred to were fired from the direction of Kingsbridge Railway Station, where the Military

were stationed at the time,
and must have been fired
into my house thro' mistake.
