

Through our Liverpool House we are favoured with your letter of 10th curt.

Without prejudice, we are writing the Propoerty Losses Committee, Dublin, as you request, and we shall advise you their reply in course.

Your contention that the bale envolved was looted during the Sinn Fein Rebellion is not admitted, as the cause appears to us to be attributable to the wrong goods being delivered, thus allowing of the correct goods being side tracked or lost.
