#### RE CLAIMOF PATRICK TULLY, 6473.

In answer to your query as to this, we beg to say, that this party was in the employment of Messrs. Lalouette of Princes Street, and after the disturbances he took up a position in the country. He believed his employers were making a claim on his behalf, and it was only on the 17th ult. that he learned such was not the case. He is a man in humble circumstances, and it would beavery great hardship if the claim were nowruled out.
