Dear Sir,

These claimants have handed me your letters of the 11th August in which you state that in the case of 702 the Committee are unable to make any recommendation and in No 702A the claim is declined as being in the nature of a consequential damage.

The facts as stated to me are that in one instance the horse was injured by a shot fired by the steamer Helga and in the other by a stray bullet and in both cases had to be destroyed as a result of their injuries.

If these particulars are correct it would appear to be a distinct hardship that no compensation has been allowed and I shall be obliged for any further information you can give me.
