*Burnie,*

I have been consulted by Mrs Margaret Kelly of 10 Lower Abbey Street, who informs that she, at the time of the rebellion, was employed as caretaker of the premises 19, Lower Abbey Street. She states that on Wednesday the 26th April 1916, the premises were occupied by the Military and she and her family were ordered to leave and had to take refuge in the Custom House.

When she returned on the 3rd May, all her belongings with the exception of an iron bedstead and sping mattress had disappeared. Her employer, Mr. Cummins, she states, informed her that he would make a claim on her behalf but it now turns out that he did not do so. I would be obliged if you will let me know if your Committee will now entertain a claim by Mrs Curry and if so, will you please send me the necessary forms.
