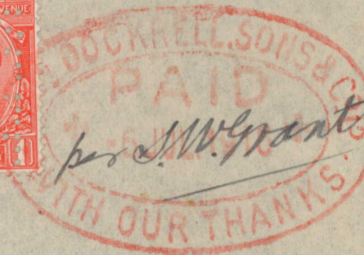

many years past. Therefore I could not send any policy, as the damage was done on the first day of the rebellion, circumstances fully explained in previous letters, and before the military were in occupation of the City Hall, I did not think at the time I was entitled to send any claim,

Many minor items of damage such as skylight glass broken mirror in doorway broken some few inches from frame, brickwork chipped, all still in same condition, I did not think it worth while ^{claiming} for, as such damage was trifling.

Further I discovered only two months since that an empty house I own in Werburgh St vacant for past fifteen months had every window in the back facing the Castle Yard broken and otherwise damaged, considering that I voluntarily loaned three bicycles free of charge to the Stafford regt during the Rebellion for despatch purposes and supplied spare counters, ohelving and boxes to the military for the purpose of barricades in Essex St, near Dolphin Hotel. I feel I have been very badly treated, especially having regard to the fact that my claim in Justice to myself should have included some further damage to roof of house I own No 11 Camden St. and which I understand was occupied some days by the Military
