The Military Authorities: "Major G. Harold Heathcote" had under consideration, a claim for "Carpenter's Tools" owned by me, which disappeared between April 22nd and May 1st of this year.

The tools were in locked up workshops, on the works known as the "Church Street and Beresford Street Housing Scheme Dublin Corporation" Messrs. Grazer and Co. Contractors. On last Friday 27th inst. Major Heathcote finally decided to hand me over to the Property and Losses (Ireland) Committee for compensation.
