Interests in the buildings

This Claimant was not a resident but was in the habit of paying frequent calls. He left his property to be minded! The fact remains, however, that in the event of an ordinary fire, the Policies on the Hotel would not cover such property as Claimant was not a resident, and there is no item in the Insurance specification covering property for which the Hotel Co. might be held responsible.

In my opinion this claim should not be admitted, and I am doubtful if Claimant expects it to be.
