I have been consulted by Mrs Annie Breen of 15 Greek

Street with reference to her claim for £39. 12. 0 in respect of the
losses she sustained arising out of the above. My client informs
me that 2 pigs, and 2 milch goats were taken from her by the rebels
and that in addition they took out of her yard 2 carts and a boiler
on the 24th & 26th Apl. last
to erect a barricade, and that owing to their action she suffered
losses to the amount as stated. My client explained to me that she
was not aware until quite recently that this claim should be forwarded
to you, as she reported the matter to the Police and was left under
the impression that they would look after her interests.

You might kindly send me forms of Declaration which I shall have completed and returned to you without delay.
