Remarks I have fully investigated this case. I have interviewed the Society's Secretary and also Carrigan & Wilson the Printers. The position is that the entire 500 books had been completed of which the Claimant had taken delivery of 200. The balance of 300. was kept in the Printers at the sole risk of the owners, and the Printers under these circumstances are relieved of responsibility. The claim therefore fell to be made by the Society and is quite in order. Carrigan & Wilson were paid their A/c. in full the claim of 30/- for the old volume is modest in my opinion.

I have been directed by the Council of the National Literary Society, to make application for compensation for about 300 copies of the Society's Journal which were destroyed by fire in messrs Corrigan & Wilson's premises Sackville Place, during the Rebellion.

I was under the impression, that messrs Corrigan and Wilson had ^{included and} taken steps to recover the loss, in their application, but they now inform me that they did not do so, but only mentioned the matter in a supplemental list.

The issue numbered about 500 copies of which about 200 copies were received. The remainder was burned. The amount claimed is £25.
