Dear Sir,

I wish to apply for compensation for the loss of 300 copies of my book - "The Pursuit and other Poems" which were burnt in the fire which destroyed the premises of Messrs Maunsel & Co, Publishers, 50 Lower Baggot Street.

This book of verses was published in the Spring of 1913. at my own expense. I paid £15 for the printing of 1000 copies and the binding of 500. In June 1914 Messrs Maunsel paid me £6. 5. 0, being the profits of the first year's sale of the book. Since then they have paid me nothing. £6. 5. 0 represents a sale of 200 copies; 300 copies therefore have been burnt. This means a net loss of £9 to me.

I have asked Messrs Maunsel to furnish you with the account of 1914.

I hope very much that I will receive this compensation without further difficulty. I am during a cure here and cannot easily get the papers relevant to the case as they are locked away in our own home which has been let to strangers.
