

Acted on 13/11/16

I am the proprietor of the firm of Frank O'Connor & Co., Bakers, carrying on business at 54 North Main Street, Wexford. I took over the business on the death of my brother and am now the sole proprietor.

My vans go to Enniscorthy to deliver bread and on this occasion went as usual but were seized in Enniscorthy and kept there the whole time of the rebellion and damaged to the extent of £30., as mentioned in my enclosed Declaration. I do not make any charge for the loss of business caused by these disturbances in Enniscorthy nor for driving the military to Enniscorthy and Arklow in my two vans and Wolsely car, none of which were the better for their travels. My car was carried to Arklow four Mounted Police as an escort.

Altogether this rising engineered by these ~~blackguards~~ blackguards for the sake of robbery and loot cost me over £120, owing to the disturbance of business and the loss of my cars, however I make no claim for this, but only for the actual damage done to my van, when taken by the rebels.

My own house was fired at by the mob because, I suppose I


