I beg to apply to
you for compensation for
property of mine which
I lost in Dublin last
Easter week in The Rebellion.
My property which I refer
to consisted of all my
clothes.

On the 19 of April. Wednesday
I arrived in Dublin from
the Belfast district & was
under orders to proceed
to Aldershot the following
Tuesday & on the following
Monday the Rebellion broke

out. & my orders were
cancelled. I was staying
at Doraghtys Hotel in
Bridge St. & on Tuesday
or Monday night. I had
to leave. & in doing so I
left all my clothes - ex-
cept those I was wearing -
behind me in the Hotel.
The evening or day the
Rebellion was over. I
went back to the Hotel
to get my things away
& I found that the
place was burnt or burned
down & all my things
were gone. I reported

my loss to the D. M. P.
at some Barracks near
- or in the neighbourhood of
Christ Church Cathedral.
On Saturday 20 May I left
Dublin to take up duty
here in Woolwich & have
since then been very busy
& never wrote about my
lost property to any-one.
I am now discharged
& at present working in
the Arsenal here in
Woolwich. I was a
Staff Sgt. in the
A. S. C. Forge Dept.
I do not want a
penny

penny more for my things
than what they were worth
when I lost them.

Although it cost me
much more to replace
them. I can give you
a detailed list of the
things I lost. Last Monday
I wrote to The Chief Commr
of the D. M. Police about
my property & today I have
received a letter from his
office referring me to you.

I shall be most
grateful to you to give
my case your kind
consideration.

I trust I am not too late
in applying to you.
