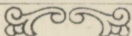

Dear Sir,

I put my church into the hands of James Gibson & Son, contractors, with a view to having leakages in the roof repaired, as, when the heavy rain came on, my church was being destroyed by these leakages in the roof. I have to-day a letter from Messrs. Gibson, stating that the cost of repairing the roof would be £7-10-0 and also a statement from the slator that the injuries to the roof and belfry were caused by bullet holes. I have no doubt these injuries were caused during the rebellion, and although I am late in making my application it is owing to the fact that I was unaware of the injuries to the church until the heavy rains came on and the water percolated through the building.

I trust the Committee will give my application for compensation favourable consideration.

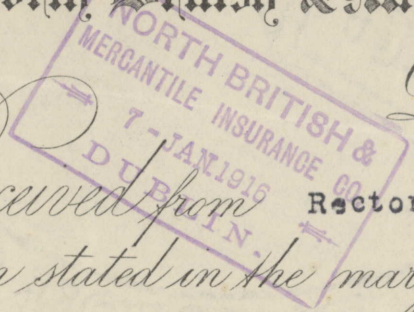
