The damage claimed was undoubtedly occasioned by the falling in of the Interests in the buildings adjoining building upon Claimant's premises. Owing to the pier now claimed for being sheeted with timber the damage escaped notice until the defect caused the sheeting to bulge. The work was in hand when we inspected the premises, as it could not be delayed fearing complete collapse. The repairs were ordered by the City Surveyor, subsequent to Claimant's Architect & Builder condemning the old Pier as unsafe. The original claim for building is No.1693.

Dear Sir -
I am sending in my claim for damage to Building
owned by me trading as Henry James, 82 Dame Street and
1, 2 & 3 Parliament St. Dublin. my Builder & I have discovered
that a shuted up papered brick stone pier supporting
the three upper floors of the house 82 Dame St & 1, 2 & 3 Parliament
Street, shows unmistakeable signs of having been shaken by the
explosion of bombs on the fall of the adjoining house No 81 Dame St
as a result of the Retelling Glades 1916. In the opening of my
business Mess W & A Roberts of 40 Canal St. this pier

would have to be taken down & rebuilt - I propose
therefore to surrender a supplementary claim in
addition to the claim already sent & which
claim contains nothing of this damage which has
now only come to light.
