Dear Sir,

Referring to interview, we now send you form of declaration made by Mrs Hickey.

As explained the delay which occurred in sending in this claim was twofold. The claim was made by Mrs Hickey as administratrix of the late Thomas Hickey who was killed during the recent Rebellion and to whom administration has been granted.

His death, and that of his son occurred through very tragic circumstances, they having both been taken prisoners by the military and were shut up in an empty house where they were killed, and the matter was enquired into by the Military and a claim was made by us on behalf of Mrs Hickey, to the military authorities, who then referred it to the Civil authorities, and eventually the Rebellion Victims Committee was formed, to whom we have sent in a claim for the loss of their lives.

Pending this enquiry the enclosed declaration was not made as in proportion to the enormous loss sustained by Mrs Hickey through the death of her husband and only son, this small claim was left in abeyance, and we would be glad if you could give it your consideration as we think you will agree that the reason for not sending it in is a very reasonable one in as much as inquiries were pending for a considerable period and if the military authorities had decided to consider the claim at that time, this claim might have prejudiced any sum which the authorities had been inclined to pay for the loss of the lives mentioned.
