Interests in the buildings I have investigated this claim, which is unconsciously exaggerated, and consider £15 reasonable compensation.

Remarks The second item in the claim, moreover, incorrectly describes the missing article as a Sofa. It consisted of what is technically known in the trade as a Buffet, and which was only capable of seating one person at a time.

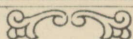
