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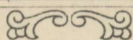

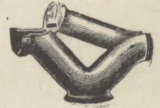

I propose to erect new pavilion, in every detail similar to former structure viz:-

Side studding rafters to be $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$

Quion posts $4\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ Doors $2\frac{1}{2}''$ red deal framed & sheeted fitted with locks & bolts

Windows (4) $4' \times 2'6''$ to open out complete with fasteners. All doors & windows to receive 3 coats of best oil paint.

Studding rafters to be covered with best galvanised iron, exterior surface to receive 2 coats of best red lead paint.

Floor to be concrete 6" above ground level length of pavilion 32' x 12' in width.

Slight of roof from floor 9' at back 8' 6" at front. To be divided into two compartments comprising committee room and Dressing Room. Furniture for dressing room as follows:-

Showers spray worked by a chain from 30 gal. cistern connected with Township Supply, waste to deliver into existing french drain. Heating stove "Daisy" P. 6

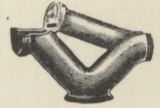

Four stools 10' in length, table 9' x 3' clothes rack 13' in length complete with hooks.
 Committee room, 1 table 6' x 3' R. D. 2 stools 7' in length 1 cupboard for lock up size 7' x 4' x 1'.

Boarding to north end boundary wall to be 4' above wall level, length 385'. Upright studding to be 3" x 3" spruce 12' apart with two cross spars 2 1/2" x 2 1/2", galvanised iron to be fixed to exterior side with galvanised nails.
