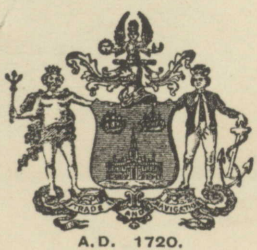

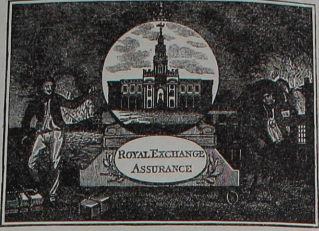

ROYAL EXCHANGE ASSURANCE.

This Instrument or Policy of Assurance Witnesseth,

That, MESSRS. W. C. A. HUNGEFORD and W. H. C. HUNGEFORD, both Care of Messrs. Hussey and Townsends, 69, South Mall, Cork, as Executors of the late W. T. HUNGEFORD, and H. J. O'BRIEN, of No. 1, Upper Kevin Street, Dublin; Saddler and harness Maker. hereinafter called the Insured, having paid or agreed to pay to the Corporation of the ROYAL EXCHANGE ASSURANCE, of London, hereinafter called the Corporation, the Sum of two pounds, eight shillings. for Insuring against Loss or Damage by Fire, as hereinafter mentioned, the Property hereinafter described in the sum or several sums following, namely:—

On the building of tenement dwellinghouse, store and office (occupied by Agent for Paint and Varnish) all communicating, brick or stone built and slated, and small part glass roofed, situate No. 59, Middle Abbey Street, Dublin £800.
