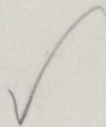

In continuation of previous memos, I have the honour to forward herewith claim of the Great Southern & Western Railway Company, Kingsbridge, Dublin.

Full enquiry has been made but as none of the Units who were in occupation of the station premises during the period of the Rebellion, have any knowledge or record of the goods having been commandeered, or received, I have informed claimants that the Military Authorities are unable to accept any responsibility for the claims, and that the claim has been referred to you as the Civil Authority.

I presume this is the claim referred to in your enquiry.
