I have enquired fully into all the circumstances herein. Moss Street is off George's Quay and the coal - which however would hardly be suitable for household purposes - was stolen from the Company's yard. Interests in the buildings

There was no satisfactory way in which to arrive at the Tonnage lost; account had not been kept of the amount consumed from the heap from time to time. The amount of coal stolen therefore was to a certain extent a matter of guesswork, and in my opinion the claimants would not allow themselves to be sufferers as the result of the guess. The firm seem respectable. There was no insurance.
