In reply to your letter JL/JC. 1973. of 9th.inst. I beg to say that the 7 c/s. of milk referred to were taken by the Military at our North Wall Station during the occupation of these premises by the Military at the time of the Rebellion. I submitted your claim to the Major General i/c Administration a considerable time back, and have repeated that Gentleman on several occasions, but up to the present I have not obtained his instructions for disposal of the matter. It is open for you to claim on the Military direct, as of course, the Company do not admit liability under the circumstance what we have done has been to assist ~~you~~ you. If you think well to write the Military you could address:- Major General i/c Administration, Head Quarters, Parkgate, Dublin.
