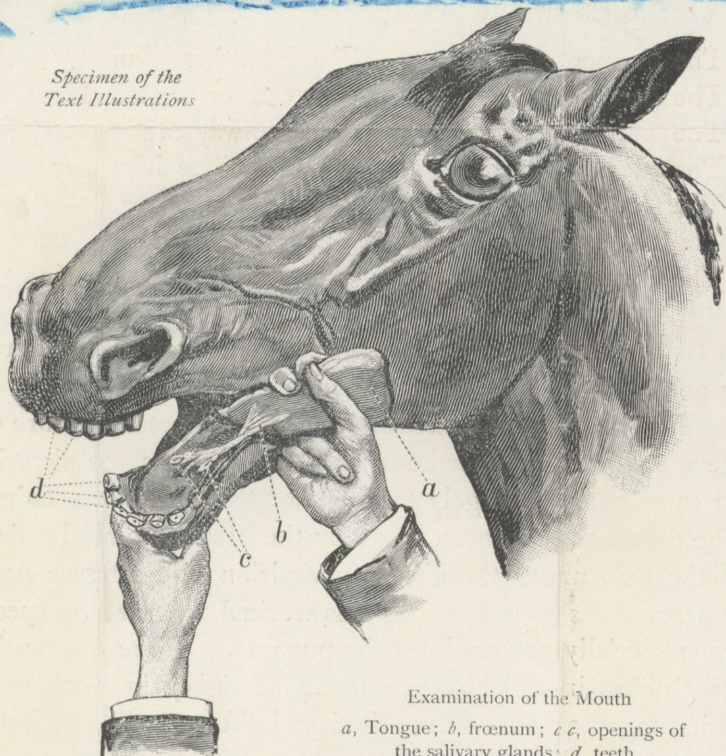

Sir, re Claim No. 6753.

We beg to return payment draft in this case, and also letter from Mr. James Neylon refusing to sign jointly with us for the receipt of the £2. 17. 0. For the information of your Committee we would like to submit the following:-

In January 1915 Mr. Neylon gave us an order for a book entitled "The Horse in Health and Disease," value £3. 17. 0. He agreed to pay £1. 0. 0. on delivery and £1. 0. 0. every three months until the balance would be discharged. He paid his first £1. 0. 0. in January, and when application was made by us for the second payment in April he returned the books to us in lieu of payment, thus by his action forfeiting any claim whatsoever on the money he had originally paid us.

We would also like to submit that Mr. Neylon signed a contract form in which it was explicitly stated that the books were our property until paid for, therefore his action in presenting a claim for £3. 17. 0. was not strictly legal. We are sorry we cannot at the moment lay our hands on the order form which he signed, and can only assume that in dealing with the case during the past few months we may have taken this out of our file and it has got mislaid. We, however, enclose an exact copy of same.

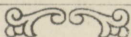
It is evident from the attitude which Mr. Neylon has taken up that he will not sign in order to enable us to obtain what is justly due to us, and we should feel obliged if your Committee would amend the order so as to make it payable to us alone; and in this respect we might say that some time ago we forwarded you a letter from Mr. Neylon, withdrawing his claim in our favour.



Dear Sir,

With reference to your representative's call at this address some few weeks ago regarding a claim made by Mr. J. Neylon of Knockroe, Tubber, Co. Clare, we beg to enclose for your perusal two letters which we have received from the claimant.

Immediately after your representative's call we wrote Mr. Neylon, pointing out to him that the goods were our property until paid for by him, and as he had returned them he should have advised us before making a claim. We requested him to withdraw his claim and allow us to substitute ours, but this he more or less refused to do in his first letter, unless we would pay him the £1. 0. 0. he had deposited on the work. As you are already aware, the sum of £2. 17. 0. is due to us, and as you will see by his letter he wishes us to refund the £1. 0. 0. he has paid. We should therefore be glad if you would settle the matter with us in accordance with his letter received to-day.
