EXTRACT from letter received from the G.W.Raily. Co., Goods
Department, Smithfield, London, E.C., dated 8th November, 1916

Red. YB33892

The Manager of the G.S.&W.Co. writes as follows :-

"This consignment in question was taken delivery of by our Carting Agents at our Northwall Station on Saturday April 22nd. Owing to Saturday being a half holiday, delivery could not be effected to claimants on that date, with the result that their car remained on our premises at Northwall over Sunday. On EasterMonday the Rebellion broke out, and the Military immediately took complete control of our premises at Northwall. The lorry containing the Bovril lay about ten feet from the door of one of our offices which was used by the Military as a Guard Room, and the premises were patrolled by the Military day and night. The Military on arrival at Northwall, ordered all our men off, and they had complete control of all our premises. When our men arrived back after all the trouble was over it was found that seven cases of Bovril were missing off the lorry, and our Carting representative mentioned the matter to the Sergeant in charge of the Guard in the presence of one of our Inspectors. I may add that the Military while at our Station commandeered anything they required. There were about 200 soldiers at Northwall at the time."
