I fear I am somewhat late in applying, but the undermentioned case is so deserving, I am anxious to bring it to the notice of your Committee.

Our office cleaner, Mrs Maria Fry, lived at the time of the rebellion at 14 Redmond's Hill, quite close to Messrs Jacob's Factory; the Sinn Feiners took possession of the premises & turned her & her small boy out. She is a soldier's widow, a widow for 3 yrs past. On returning to her premises after the rebellion she found all her blankets and some other household goods removed; together with about 18/- in cash, her allowance from the Royal Patriotic Fund recently received. Altogether she lost about  $\frac{1}{2}$  3 in value.

I made application to the Mansion House Relief Fund for her, but could get only 15/- in compensation. Mrs Fry is now in urgent need of her blankets & has.
