Dear Sir,

G.S.& W.R. Kingsbridge Diners' Association.

I send you herewith particulars as regards claim for damage done to the stock and effects &c, of the Clerical Staff Dining Hall during the Easter disturbance.

This Claim was originally sent to the Military Authorities to whom the Dining Hall was handed over on Monday 24th. April and was used exclusively by them until 3rd. June 1916, both in the capacity of an Officers Mess and a supply station for meals, to the men who were quartered in Kingsbridge and Environs, and I may here add was greatly appreciated by the various units who were in occupation at Kingsbridge from time to time.

It may appear strange to you, the quantity of knives, forks, spoons, plates &c, that are missing, and the following is the explanation, viz: In a great number of cases the various pickets, reserves &c were on duty at a considerable distance from the Dining Hall and when the meals were cooked, the plates, knives &c. were sent to these men and evidently no person was held responsible for the return of the articles.

Trusting this application will have your favourable consideration and thanking you in anticipation.


