

With reference to your letter of the 13th inst. directed to Mrs. Mary Burke of 34 Mount Pelier Hill, same has been handed to us to answer. We formulated the claim on behalf of this lady for £25:11:0: and we must say that we are unable to follow how you arrive at the sum of £10 as compensation. Our client's property has been absolutely destroyed, save in respect of a sum of £2:16:6: and she will not be able to replace the articles for the sum of £10. We would ask you to communicate with the Assessor and let us know how the figure is arrived at.

I have received notification that I have been awarded £10-0-0 (Ten pounds) in settlement of my claim No. 82 for which I thank you.

I shall feel very grateful if you can reconsider your decision as to the amount to which I am entitled, as when making my claim I only entered the actual amount of damage done to my furniture & clothes, and the loss of my furniture means a lot to me, as I am a widow depending largely on boarders as a means of support, and the sum of ten pounds would not replace the things I have lost.



We received your letter of the 22nd inst. and in reply beg to state that we lodged a claim on behalf of Mrs. Mary Burke for £25:11: and in respect of which claim a sum of only £10 was awarded by the Committee. We consider that the amount awarded to this lady is totally inadequate, as it would be impossible for her to purchase the various articles of furniture, clothing, etc. which were destroyed by rifle bullets for the above amount, and under the circumstances we think it is a case which should be reconsidered by the Committee and a further payment made to Mrs. Burke.




